1. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

- 1.1. The Organising Authority (OA) is the South Caernarfonshire Yacht Club, Abersoch.
- 1.2. The Organising Authority is organising the event in association with the British Dragon Association (BDA).

2. RULES

- 2.1. The Championship will be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 2.2. The Rules and Regulations of the International Dragon Association and the BDA will apply.
- 2.3. The prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association (National Authority) that will apply will be notified on the Official Notice Board.
- 2.4. In the event of conflict between this Notice of Race (NOR) and the Sailing Instructions (SI), the SI shall prevail (this changes rule 63.7).

3. ADVERTISING

- 3.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.4.1.
- 3.2. Failure to comply with this regulation shall not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes rule 60.1(a).

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. Only International Dragon Class yachts holding valid measurement certificates shall compete.
- 4.2. The helm and at least one other member of the crew shall be up to date members of their National Dragon Association.
- 4.3. Boats entered by BDA members shall either have paid a fee to the BDA for 2019 or replaced their boat with one that has already paid a fee for 2019. Any personal details provided as part of the entry / crew registration may be forwarded to the BDA for membership validation.
- 4.4. Entries shall be received prior to midnight on 8th July 2019.
- 4.5. A formal entry from each boat shall be submitted via the entry web site accompanied by the appropriate entry fee (See NOR 5).
- 4.6. Late entries received after midnight on 8th July 2019 may only be accepted at the discretion of the OA.
- 4.7. Entry will be finalised on completion of registration.

5. FEES

- 5.1. The entry fees are as follows

Boats entering the Edinburgh Cup get a free of charge entry into the Northern Championship

All times are UK Local (British Summer time). All fees are GB pounds Sterling (GBP) and payable to South Caernarfonshire Yacht Club.

5.2. Payments can be made as advised during the online entry process.

5.3. The fee will include:

5.3.1. Participation in the Edinburgh Cup.

5.3.2. Launching and lifting at Hafan Pwllheli Marina (See NOR 7 for details)

5.3.3. Moorings in front of SCYC Abersoch: (See NOR 7 for details).

5.3.4. Three tickets per boat for the Edinburgh Cup welcome drinks (Mon 15th July) plus the champagne reception (Wed 17th July)

6. REGISTRATION AND MEASUREMENT

6.1. All boats shall register in person at the South Caernarfonshire Yacht Club.

6.2. Entrants shall bring the boat's measurement certificate to registration, or a copy can be emailed to jude@scyc.co.uk in advance. A copy of the measurement form may also be required.

6.3. Measurement of boats and weighing of the crew will take place prior to the commencement of racing - see NOR 8 for timings.

6.4. Boats shall not present any unmeasured sails for registration and measurement. Sail declarations shall be completed at registration.

6.5. No more than eight sails per boat may be submitted.

6.6. Boats shall not use any sails other than the eight sails listed on the Sails Declaration Form except with the prior written permission of the race committee, and then only in exceptional circumstances.

6.7. All boats shall be afloat and all crew weighed by the end of registration.

6.8. The latest time for launching is shown in NOR 8.

6.9. The OA reserves the right to conduct measurement and safety equipment checks at any time.

6.10. Substitution of crew will not be permitted without the prior written permission of the race committee. The replacement crew member shall be weighed before racing.

6.11. Each boat shall sail with the same number of crew for the whole event.

6.12. The Race Officer will permit the use of a personal sail number issued by the BDA or other relevant National Association if this number is not intended to be used by another competing boat which has been granted such number on its measurement certificate.

7. BERTHING & CRANAGE

7.1. Boats shall be launched at Pwllheli marina and either (i) sailed over to Abersoch bay and moored on the moorings provided in front of SCYC at Abersoch or (ii) if prior private arrangements have been made by the relevant owner, berthed in Pwllheli marina. See "Ed Cup Launch and Recovery" document downloadable from the website.

7.2. In the event of a strong south east or easterly winds the fleet will be instructed in good time by the race officer to berth at an assigned berthing area at Pwllheli marina, rafting as required.

7.3. One lift in, one lift out, Abersoch based moorings, and Pwllheli marina berths as per 7.2 for the event is included in the entry fee for the combined two championships.

7.4. Boats shall be required to use test certificated lifting slings; the appropriate test certificate should be presented to Hafan Pwllheli marina staff prior to any lift taking place.

7.5. The crane will be available from 10:00 to 17:00 on Saturday 13th July 2019 and from 13:00 to 17:00 on Monday 15th July for launching and will be available immediately after racing on Friday 19th July 2019 for lifting out. Boats wishing to use the crane outside these times should do so by arrangement with Hafan Pwllheli marina staff.



7.6. Boats shall not be hauled out during the Championship, except with prior written permission of the race committee.



8. SCHEDULE

8.1. Six races are scheduled. It is the race committee's intention to run a maximum of two races each day. However, additional races may be held on any day as necessary with a view to achieving a series.

8.2. The scheduled **first warning signal is 1055.**

- 8.4.** No warning signal will be displayed after 1400 on the final day of the Edinburgh Cup.
- 8.5.** A fully detailed schedule covering both the Northern Championship and the Edinburgh Cup (including registration, craning and social events) will be available online.
- 8.6.** If the Edinburgh Cup is running to schedule it is intended that the second race on Thursday 18 July will be the "Crew's Race". The results will not count towards the Edinburgh Cup series. Further details will be given in the SI.

9. COURSES

9.1. The courses to be sailed will be shown in detail in the SI but will be of windward/leeward type.

9.3. The Racing areas will be the waters to the east of SCYC in Tremadog Bay

10. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The SI will be available at registration and may be available at an earlier date on the event website.

11. TROPHY & PRIZES

11.1. Daily prizes (in addition to the event trophies detailed below) will be awarded to the first boat and the first Corinthian boat in each race, except that a boat can only win a first-place daily prize once during the Championship. Thereafter the daily prizes will be presented to the highest placed boat that hasn't already won a daily prize.

11.2. Each winner of a trophy shall have temporary possession of the trophy for a period of one year, and will arrange appropriate insurance for such trophy. The name of the winning boat and its owner should be engraved on the trophy by the winner.

11.3. The Overall Edinburgh Cup Trophies and prizes will be awarded on Friday 19 July at the Edinburgh Cup prize giving.

11.4. The overall Edinburgh Cup Trophies will be awarded as follows:

12. CORINTHIAN CLASSIFICATION

12.1. To qualify for the Corinthian Division and Trophy the World Sailing Sailor Classification Code,

Regulation 22, shall apply and all crew (including the helm) shall hold a valid Group 1 Classification. Unclassified sailors will be deemed to be Group 3, thus ineligible for the Corinthian Division.

- 12.2.** A boat entered in the Corinthian Division shall also be entered automatically in the Open Division and shall be eligible for prizes and trophies in both divisions.
- 12.3.** Details of the World Sailing Sailor Classification Code and information on how to apply can be found on the World Sailing website: www.sailing.org/classification
- 12.4.** The closing date for the receipt of valid Corinthian entries shall be 1200 on 13 July.
Crew Declaration will be validated at Registration.
- 12.5.** Each entry shall include a complete crew list and show the World Sailing ID number and classification and classification expiry date for each crew. Late entries for the Corinthian Division may only be accepted at the discretion of the OA.
- 12.6.** All crew shall hold valid classifications prior to this date that do not expire until after the final day of the regatta.
- 12.7.** Should a boat whose Corinthian entry has been checked and accepted need to change a crew member between the closing date of the entry and the start of, or with appropriate permission, during the regatta, the name of the new crew member with their valid World Sailing ID number and classification and classification expiry date must be submitted to the OA for their approval.
- 12.8.** All crew lists will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 12.9.** The Classification protest time limit is the end of protest time on the first day of racing or, in the case of a crew change, at the end of protest time on the first day of racing of the new crew member.

13. SCORING

- 13.1.** Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
 - 13.1.1.** When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - 13.1.2.** Pursuant to RRS Appendix A 2.1., when five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14. VHF RADIOS

- 14.1.** Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephone communications.
- 14.2.** Race information will be given on marine VHF. The channel to be used will be stated in the SI. Race committee communication on the water shall not be available to competitors.

15. SUPPORT BOATS

- 15.1.** All support boats including coach, press, private and spectator boats shall register during the registration period. For craning and berthing (not included in the entry fee) contact Hafan Pwllheli Marina
- 15.2.** Support boats shall be marked with the appropriate country flag. Additionally, the OA may request for these boats to use additional markers or flags.
- 15.3.** In the event of an emergency the race committee may request support boats for their assistance.

16. RISK STATEMENT

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- 16.1.** They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- 16.2.** They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;

- 16.3. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- 16.4. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 16.5. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 16.6. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- 16.7. It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event;

17. INSURANCE

- 17.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per event or the equivalent.
- 17.2. Proof of such insurance may be required at registration.

18. MEDIA RIGHTS

Competitors give absolute rights to the OA and permission for video footage or photographs of themselves or their boat to be published in any media for press, editorial or advertising purposes.

19. DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around any boat between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.
